# OECD Recommendation on Digital Government Strategies

## Openness and Engagement

- 1) Openness, transparency and inclusiveness
- 2) Engagement and participation in a multi-actor context in policy making and service delivery
- 3) Creation of a data-driven culture
- 4) Protecting privacy and ensuring security

## Governance and Coordination

- 5) Leadership and political commitment
- 6) Coherent use of digital technology across policy areas
- 7) Effective organizational and governance frameworks to coordinate
- 8) Strengthen international cooperation with other governments

## Capacities to Support Implementation

- 9) Development of clear business cases
- 10) Reinforced institutional capacities
- 11) Procurement of digital technologies
- 12) Legal and regulatory framework
